The Year 2012 was spent completing projects started in 2011 which are both featured in the Real Log Home Calendar for 2013 (June and August).

Jim and Sue Johnson added tongue and groove pine, to the inside of their 1120 sq ft. custom Real Log Home ranch.



Red cedar was used in the bath and re-claimed planed flooring was added to the great room. A hickory kitchen



added just enough contrast to the logs. The outside wood furnace was installed and the infloor tubing added in the subfloor.

Soon after an open house in early

September, Jim and Sue moved in. Fall skyscapes were enjoyed from the porch as the sun settled over the Brantling Ski



Area. When the weather took a turn, the south facing gable windows and dining bump collected the passing warmth.

Bill and Peg Scheg have come a long way since the fire in November of 2010, which totally destroyed their Real Log Home, built in 1977. The new design welcomes in light from the morning sun to its setting in the evening.



Landscaping has been a process, with more being added in the spring. An antler chandelier was hoisted to the center of the living room, and custom cherry cabinets, glass doors, and granite countertops installed in the



kitchen. Peg was planning on decorating a revolving Christmas tree in the loft to celebrate. It will be a great place for family and friends to gather and fellowship. wood flooring is being considered for the great-room and a spring open house will be scheduled.

Pete Scheid added a four car log sided garage with living space above to his custom Cape Real Log Home, built in 2005.

Wayne and Carol Miller and their Real Log Home were featured in the "Home and Garden" Section of the

Finger Lakes Times on Oct. 5, 2012. Wayne built the home



in 1993 north of Lyons in a wooded area. Both Wayne and Carol have continued to develop the area with a potting shed, area vegetable and flower gardens, and their special decorating touches. As they reflected over the past 19 years, it was a dream that took a lot of sweat, but they both have felt filled with the joy of "log living" they have come to know.

Terry Chiarilli and Jeb

Dainard are in the final stages of setting a delivery of their 1834 sq. ft. Custom Real Log Home Cape with attached garage in Lima. This has been a multi-year project that is finally coming together. The lot will allow Jeb to consolidate



much of the equipment he uses caring for area lawns and snow removal needs. We got the house and garage staked out before the weather hit which also gives them time to consider any other options for tweaking the building orientation before the digging starts.

The home will have a bedroom/den on the first floor, a breakfast area, dining room, laundry/ bath area and kitchen. The master bedroom suite will be on the second floor along with the loft area and another bedroom.

Another project that is nearing the final stages of design



be built across from Ski Valley north of Naples, NY. It is a beautiful setting with lots of wooded areas, ponds, bogs, and

trails. This will be a special home for generations of families to retreat for recreation, hunting, and holidays. A camp built in the 1920s will be dismantled and a full Superior Wall installed with a walkout to the south. The home is designed to be completely open with 9 ft plus ceilings from one end to the other. Bedrooms will be located on the second floor as well as room in the lower level. This will be a 8 " "Swedish Cope" Real Log Home that will have lots of added touches to make it one-of-kind.

There are more projects in the works, so stay tuned for updates.

The last week of April, Jean and I journeyed off to Rome and then on to Switzerland. Rome was "old", the trains were



fast, and Switzerland was "heaven". Lauterbrunnen hasn't changed and we discovered and studied several "log structures" built in the 1600-1700s in an area surrounding the town and toured through
